### **July is the WMFC Research Month for 2020**

The WMFC has been trying to identify a research project that will make a difference for WM patients. At our May Board meeting, the Board selected a research proposal by Dr. Zach Hunter of the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. Dr. Hunter, who earlier helped uncover the MYD88 and CXCR4 mutations in patients who have WM, will take 300 WM patients and analyze their DNA, RNA and epigenomic changes to see if there are new patterns that emerge that can help identify new drug targets and possibly help specify the treatment a WM patient should receive. It is complicated, uses big data, but will allow Dr. Hunter and his colleagues to work with other researchers to find out more about how WM treatments could be more specific for each individual's genetic makeup. Stay tuned to hear more about Dr. Hunter's research and how WMers in Canada can help him complete this work.
